### **RISING STAR AWARD**

2020's Rising Star Award winner is Matthew Hanley of Vail Rubber Works.

These resources are then directed into programs which aid the low income and otherwise disadvantaged throughout the age spectrum, from preschoolers to the elderly of Southwest Michigan. The funds include dollars which are targeted at very specific problems, as well as dollars which are more flexible in nature.

The SMCAA is dedicated to empowering diverse people in need and supporting their journey towards economic security. Our vision is to be a beacon of support in a strong thriving community by helping people and changing lives.

In 2020, the SMCAA was able to service 54,634 households with food and personnel hygiene products from April through December. They assisted in avoiding over 424 household evictions, provided 2,047 bed nights at their homeless shelter, distributed 16,936 masks to the vulnerable populations in the tri-county area, and had over 7,200 volunteer hours at their warehouse.

Like many restaurants in our community, 221 Main – Restaurant & Cocktail House, a steakhouse specializing in steak, seafood, and whiskey and Silver Harbor Brewing Company, a brewery restaurant, were greatly impacted by the closing of indoor dining at their respective locations. After watching the success other communities were seeing with creating outdoor dining areas called social districts, the two joined together with an idea to move the inside out in an effort to combat capacity restrictions for indoor dining. After speaking with the City of St. Joseph, Pleasant Street Plaza was created in downtown St. Joseph which would allow for a relaxing, safe environment for guests to enjoy offerings from each respectively.

### EXCELLENCE IN PANDEMIC LENDING AWARD

While reviewing the nominations for the Excellence in Pandemic Lending Award, there was a common response from the committee that all nominees in this category deserve to be recognized. All 5 nominated financial institutions were honored with this award due to their
